Letter from Auxiliary President Harriet Brown and Volunteer Director Sharon Hannaby

Realizing that we have new volunteers and, some who have been with Frederick Health for years, we wanted to share some background information about the Auxiliary and how you can be more involved.

Although the hospital has always had volunteers, in fact, it was a group of volunteers who started The Frederick City Hospital (1902), it wasn't until 50 years after the hospital opened (1952) that the Auxiliary was formed. The volunteers needed to be an "official entity" in order to raise money for the hospital.

The Auxiliary Board of Directors is made up of 8 officers who form the Executive Committee (president, president-elect, 1st VP, 2nd VP, treasurer, recording secretary, corresponding secretary, membership secretary, and parliamentarian) and the chair(s) of our larger service areas. Most of the officers have a 2-year term with elections annually, replacing half of the officers each year. Below is a brief description of the duties of each officer:

President – oversees all functions of the Auxiliary, sits on the Hospital's Board of Directors, works closely with hospital administration and the volunteer office

President-Elect – is responsible for the Auxiliary service areas, works with the chair(s) of the services, fills in for the president when he/she is absent, automatically becomes the president when his/her term expires

1st Vice President – is responsible for publicity for the Auxiliary and its events

2nd Vice President – is responsible for the Recruitment and Appreciation Committee of the Auxiliary and the activities the committee plans (picnic, volunteer recruitment events, fashion show, etc.)

Recording Secretary – is responsible for taking and distributing minutes of Auxiliary Board meetings and meetings of the Executive Committee

Corresponding Secretary – is responsible for sending cards on behalf of the Auxiliary (thank you notes for donations, get well cards for volunteers, etc.)

Membership Secretary – is responsible for keeping the roster of Auxiliary members and collecting annual dues

Parliamentarian – this position is appointed by the president and is responsible for assuring that decisions and processes are followed according to Roberts Rules of Order

Chairmen from larger services are the contact for volunteers on their service, they help keep procedures up-to-date, and some train new volunteers for their service. They represent their service for the Auxiliary Board.

The full Auxiliary Board meets the 3rd Tuesday morning each month, skipping December and July. The Executive Committee meets as needed outside of the full Board meetings. Any Auxiliary member is welcome to attend the Board meetings.

In addition to the services people see around the hospital, there are also volunteers running Select Seconds Thrift Shop and volunteering at some hospital offsite locations. The Auxiliary raises funds for the hospital and for scholarships to students entering medical fields. Fundraising is done through the Gift Shop, Select Seconds and Auxiliary sponsored vendor sales at the hospital. Separate fundraising efforts support the Auxiliary scholarships.

During COVID and the shutdowns, a number of hospital auxiliaries were disbanded. We want our Auxiliary to remain a strong support for our hospital for many years to come. In order to do this, we need volunteers who can "step up" to take leadership roles. How can you get more involved with the Auxiliary Committees or Board? We have been working on the \$47 million Critical Care Expansion at the hospital for the last several years. I am pleased to say that we are nearing the end of these construction efforts. Another section of the Emergency Department opened this month, adding ten newly renovated patient treatment bays and the final construction phase will be complete by the end of this year. This progress would not have been possible without your gracious and substantial donations and steadfast efforts.

In addition to this exciting expansion at our hospital, our new Frederick Health Brunswick location is scheduled to open in September of this year. The 2023 Employees of the Year were Jeff Weaver, the Supply Chain Manager, and Dr. Kathy Troupe, a provider in our new Comprehensive Care Center. We also recently recognized the efforts of our Frederick Health Jr. Volunteers. This year, 28 high school students that volunteered at least 100 hours were honored with a pin, a letter signed by the President of the United States, and a certificate. Of this group, one individual received the Gold Award (250+) hours, four received the Silver Award (175-250 hours), and 23 received the Bronze Award (100-175 hours). Supporting the growth of the next generation of healthcare professionals ensures that our community will continue to be healthy, happy, and cared for.

You have been a steady, calming, and supportive presence; we are stronger, and our community is better because of your efforts. Sewing Auxiliary Pillow Project

The Sewing Auxiliary sends out a big 'Thank You' to the Walkersville "Quazy Quilters." Annually, the quilting guild members complete a community service project that utilizes their leftover fabric scraps. This year the guild leader reached out to the Frederick Health Sewing Auxiliary for patterns to make comfort neck and surgical pillow forms. In short order, they cut, sewed and donated over 200 pillow cases. They had so much fun doing this hands-on project, they regrouped a couple of weeks later and completed another 200 cases.

Also, a big "Thank You" to Marcia Walker who likewise used her quilting material scraps to make 125 surgical pillow forms.

While it is tempting for the Sewing Auxiliary to purchase new fabric for their neck and surgical pillow forms, the quilters' scrap project was a great way to save money and help build up the auxiliary's inventory of pillow forms.

Thanks again to the Walkersville "Quazy Quilters" and to Marcia for their outstanding community sewing project.

Sewing Auxiliary Show & Tell

The Sewing Auxiliary provides an array of therapeutic items to the Frederick Health Hospital. Three members of the group meet each Monday morning at the "Village" location to design, cut, iron and sew colorful, "Busy Aprons" aka "Fidget Aprons." The ladies are into their 2nd year of producing the aprons and no two aprons are alike! In 2022, the ladies made a total of 125 pieces.

The aprons are used for treating and relieving anxiety in Alzheimer's and Dementia patients. The pockets, zippers, hooks, loops, snaps, corduroy flaps, etc. on each handmade apron provide sensatory stimulation and objects to keep a patient's hands busy. The aprons improve patient finger dexterity and eye-hand coordination and they help to relieve restlessness and boredom and aid in keeping the patient from wandering off.

When completed, the aprons are delivered to the Frederick Health Nursing office where they are distributed as needed.

The Sewing Auxiliary is making a difference and you can help ...the group is always looking for donations of clean fabric — they request practical, non-frilly cottons, light weight denim or canvas for walker bags and notions of all sorts, especially zippers. We still need volunteers for all payroll deduction sales and although volunteering for the vendor sales might not be as glamorous as some of the other volunteer services, it's a great way to participate in a service that raises funds, provides a unique opportunity to interact with hospital staff and earn additional volunteer service hours. You might even find a few minutes to do a little shopping and find a



few bargains. Fundraising also provides an opportunity for hospital staff to purchase a wide variety of merchandise without leaving the facilities.


